POKER RUN RULES

Those participating in the "All In" Poker Run will adhere to the following rules:

You do not need to be an existing member of the Experimental Aircraft Association (EAA) Chapter 538. Anyone can participate. The "All In" Poker Run is open to all pilots, their families, and friends.

The "All In" Poker Run takes place on **Friday and Saturday**, **October 27 and 28, 2017**. Sealed envelopes with cards will only be available those days at each airport.

There will be NO reschedule if the event is canceled due to weather.

The start location is your home airport. The start time on **Friday, October 27, 2017** is up to you and your passengers depending on your plane, your assessment of weather conditions, etc.

We are requesting you pre-register for this event. Please see registration below.

The entrance fee is \$20.00 for the first hand and \$5.00 per each additional hand (no limit) and is payable upon arriving at Falcon Field Airport (KFFZ) when recording your hand(s). Cash only and exact change is preferred.

All hands must be presented at the Falcon Field Airport (KFFZ) no later than 2:00 PM on **Saturday**, **October 28, 2017**.

For each hand you play, you will pick up one sealed envelope containing a card at each of the 5 airports. You may NOT trade cards with other participants. You may NOT open the sealed envelope. These are considered cheating. You and all involved parties will be disqualified and no refunds will be made.

POKER RUN RULES Continued

• You do not need to fly the entire course. If you cannot make it to all of the airports, additional decks of cards will be at the final destination airport so that you can still get a full hand.

- You can go to the airports in any order on **Friday and Saturday**, **October 27 and 28**, **2017** with the final airport being Falcon Field (KFFZ), checking in no later than 2:00 PM on Saturday. The 5 airports are:
- P52 Cottonwood Airport
- KSEZ Sedona Airport
- o KINW Winslow-Lindberg Regional Airport
- KPAN Payson Airport
- o KFFZ Falcon Field Airport

- 7. If you have an open seat(s) would you be interested in taking another player(s) that would like to participate but have no aircraft available?

IMPORTANT NOTES:

1. The Experimental Aircraft Association (EAA) Chapter 538 will hosting the "All In" Poker Run during the

same weekend as the Copperstate Fly-in in Mesa, AZ. The last Poker Run stop and your hand will be

recorded at Falcon Field. Due to this, once you have landed at Falcon Field you will be responsible for

all entry fees required by Copperstate. Copperstate and EAA Chapter 538 are separate entities and the

"All In" Poker Run is not a co-sponsored event. Our intension is to offer some additional fun and scenic

flying while you're in the area. If you would like to participate in the Poker Run but you ARE NOT or

DO NOT want to attend Copperstate then other means of recording your hand(s) will be required.

assumes no liability for the safe operation of your aircraft and your flight. As PIC of your aircraft, you

assume full responsibility. Please check all NOTAM's, TFR's, weather, and ensure that your aircraft is

in airworthy condition. As a passenger, it is your responsibility to ensure that the person that you are

flying with is competent to operate the aircraft.
