PRESIDENTS AUGUST REPORT

Welcome members, family and friends of EAA Chapter 538.

AirVenture has come to a close. The capstone event for Experimental Aircraft Association recently came to a close. Over 608,000 persons attended the event, the third time the total attendance exceeded 600,000. There were 16,378 aircraft operations over the 10 day period from July 23 through July 31. There were 12,000 campsites used with over 40,000 patrons. 3,176 included: A record 1,420 vintage aircraft registered, plus 1,089 homebuilt aircraft, 354 Warbirds, 148 aerobatic aircraft, 112 seaplanes, 33 ultralight's, and 27 rotorcraft. By all accounts is was a very successful event. An estimated \$170 million was generated as revenue for the 5 related counties. We have several members who attended the event this year and I am looking forward to hearing their stories.

We have our own events coming over the next year. The Buckeye Air Fair/Copperstate Fly-in is still planned for the early months 2022. (Secretary's note February 17 to 20) The event planners are always looking for volunteers and I would like to encourage all members to participate as the volunteer effort is essential to for these events to be successful. I would like to set up a 538 Chapter booth to advertise our organization plus have some examples of member projects. If anyone is interested in participating, please contact Carlos Hernandez.

The Davis-Monthan Airshow is planned for this fall and we can expect the Luke Airshow next year. Fly-in to these events are by invitation only, but they are always looking for aircraft to display to otherwise represent the spectrum of aviation. The Public Affairs office would be the best place to begin your inquiry. Attendance of these events are always free and it will be fun to have a chapter road trip. If anyone is interested, please contact Carlos Hernandez.

Once temperatures cool down and other restrictions become lifted, I would like to begin our pancake breakfasts again. This October or November would be a good time to do this. There is quite a bit of coordination to do this. One of the requirements is to have a food handlers card. It will be upon you to get one to be a food server. It can be found at: https://www.statefoodsafety.com/food-handler/Arizona/Maricopa-county. It now costs \$10 but is good for 3 years. We also support the Stiller Airpark Chapter' Young Eagles event in early December. Also this spring we should have another breakfast at our hanger. We are looking for volunteers for these events. If you are interested in participating, please contact Carlos Hernandez.

I have been contacted by the son of John McKinney. John McKinney was the owner of a Stitts Playmate that was built by our chapter' founder Leroy Castle. He received my letter and has offered the aircraft to us again. The last time we were offered the aircraft, it was in the middle of a very hot August. The trailer that comes with it needs a bit work to make it safe to travel. I was waiting for it to get a bit cooler. I called to coordinate the Pick-up, and Mr. McKenny had begun a trip with no idea as to his return. Now we have this opportunity, I intend to act quickly. This aircraft will be an important component to our chapter activities moving forward from here. If anyone is interested in being part of a small crew to pick up the aircraft, please contact Carlos Hernandez.

Once we have the aircraft in our possession, the next step will be to form a chapter flying club. It will be expected for the club to acquire the aircraft from the chapter. All proceeds will benefit the Chapter and our hangar project. The club will have to be a separate organization from this chapter. It will be necessary to maintain and care for the aircraft. This would be an ideal place for members who do not have their own aircraft and need one to fly. Basic flight instruction can be performed in an experimental aircraft if YOU are the owner. The FAA now requires a Letter of Authority (LOA) to permit this. If anyone is interested in participating in this club, please contact Carlos Hernandez.

Our hangar project is moving forward, but are currently in the plans review stage. This is a back-and-forth process that must occur until all the design elements are satisfactory. While we are not moving forward as quickly as we like, we are moving as quickly as possible. Carlos Hernandez is fully involved with this project and is giving everything he has to the design and submittal for the hangar. Please give Carlos your thanks and appreciation for everything he has done so far. But seriously folks... We can't

NOTICE OF ROAD WORK-GLENDALE AVE CLOSURES



Glendale Avenue Reconstruction Project

Concrete Placement for the North Side of Glendale Avenue Begins Soon

Work continues for reconstruction of Glendale Avenue from 99th Avenue to El Mirage Road. The segment of roadway from, and including, the 99th Avenue intersection to just east of the Agua Fria Bridge will be concrete, with the segment west of the Agua Fria Bridge to El Mirage Road remaining asphalt. The project includes drainage improvements, concrete work, asphalt sidewalk, and street lighting. Project completion is expected in Spring 2022.

- Scheduled to take place Monday, August 9, Glendale Avenue traffic from 99th Avenue to the Agua Fria Bridge will be shifted to the south side of Glendale Avenue onto the newly placed concrete pavement. Glendale Avenue will once again be open to travel in both directions from 99th Avenue to El Mirage Road, with one lane in each direction.
- Scheduled to begin Monday, August 9, Glen Harbor Boulevard will be CLOSED on the north side of Glendale Avenue, with no access to or from north Glen Harbor Boulevard from Glendale Avenue. Glen Harbor Boulevard traffic north of Glendale Avenue should use Northern Avenue as an alternate route during this time, until Glen Harbor can be reopened, expected to be in October. Glen Harbor Boulevard on the south side of Glendale Avenue (for access to Glendale Municipal Airport) will remain open.
- 99th Avenue is currently closed on the north side of Glendale Avenue with no access to or from north 99th Avenue at Glendale Avenue. Please use Northern Avenue as an alternate access during this time.
- The week of August 9, crews are scheduled to lower utilities to prevent them from being damaged during the milling (asphalt removal) activity, and scheduled for the week of August 16, crews will mill (remove) asphalt on the north side of Glendale Avenue, from 99th Avenue to the Agua Fria Bridge.
- During work on the north side, once again, crews will apply a cement-treated-base to the subsurface of the future roadway to prepare for the concrete. This will be followed by concrete work, which is scheduled to take place during night hours, Monday through Friday nights, excluding holidays, to provide a quality end product due to the higher daytime temperatures.
- Access to businesses and facilities is being maintained, although for properties on the north side of Glendale Avenue in the project area, if there is more than one access
 to your property, one may be closed to accommodate the work effort. Detour signage will be in place to direct travelers around the restrictions or to appropriate access
 points. Please allow extra time for travel during this work.





HISTORY APACHE LEAP CLIFF

During the 1870's, at the height of the American Indian Wars, a company of Apache horsemen were ambushed by US cavalry. After losing 50 men, the Apache retreated up the mountain later named Apache Leap. Accepting defeat, the remaining Apache leapt to their death rather than being captured by the US cavalry.

Superior was originally called Queen, then Hastings, and under the latter name was platted in 1900. Queen had a population of around 100 circa 1880. There was a general store, 2 hotels, numerous saloons, and a post office. The Queen post office closed Sept. 15, 1881.

The Superior townsite was laid out in 1902, and named after the Lake Superior and Arizona Copper Company (LS&A). The Superior post office opened on December 29, 1902. Magma Mine Magma Arizona Railroad in Superior, 1967

The origin of Magma Mine began on March 22, 1875, when Charles G. Mason and four companions found native silver, and staked the Silver King claim. On March 29, 1875, the Silver Queen (Magma) vein was staked, and the Silver Queen Mining Company was organized in 1880. However, with the depletion of silver, the Silver Queen shut down in 1893, and the Silver King in 1896. In 1910, William Boyce Thompson and George Gunn bought the Silver Queen mine, and organized the Magma Copper Company. A 300-ton-per-day concentrator was built in 1914. In 1915, a narrow-gauge railway connected Superior with the Southern Pacific Railroad, which was converted to standard gauge in 1923. A smelter was built in 1924.

After 71 years of production, the Magma mine closed in August 1982 due to high operating costs and declining copper prices. Operations resumed in September 1990, but the mine closed again on June 28, 1996. During its 86-year life (1910–1996). the Magma mine produced approximately 27.6 million short tons of ore averaging about 4.9% copper, recovering 1,299,718 short tons of copper, 36,550 short tons of zinc, approximately 686,000 ounces of gold and 34.3 million ounces of silver. The old Magma No. 9 shaft atop Apache Leap is being used to explore the huge Resolution Copper deposit below.



Fred Kirkland has made some modifications to his KitFox airplane. I added vortex generators to my Kitfox. It reduced my power on stall speed without flaps from 41 down to 35 mph.. Worth the effort. I located the VGs 35 mm behind the leading edge which is 4% of the cord.





John Warner had the great fortune to fly to OSH with the C2A (COPA to AirVenture) group, a formation group of Cirrus pilots (COPA = Cirrus Owners and Pilots Association).

The formation flying was a new and exciting experience for me, and I got a few pictures and videos posted on a Google drive, link below. We flew a 26 ship formation from Janesville, WI to Oshkosh on Sunday morning for a mass arrival at 8:00 A.M., and landed in formation on 36L and 36R, then taxied as a group to the North 40 general aviation camping section where they set up camp.





RESULTS FROM AIRVENTURE 2021

August 3, 2021 – Comment from EAA CEO and Chairman Jack Pelton:

"This was perhaps the most challenging set of circumstances we've ever faced as an organization to make the event happen. I could not be more proud of our volunteers, staff, and participants on the way they came together to exceed our expectations and make AirVenture 2021 a truly memorable experience."

Attendance: Approximately 608,000 – Only the third time attendance has surpassed 600,000 and within 5 percent of 2019's record total. Comment from Pelton:

"We went into this year not knowing what AirVenture would look like and how big of an event was possible. The aviation community spoke loudly, though – it was ready to come to Oshkosh and we were happy that we could welcome them. Our theme was 'The Wait is Over,' and indeed it was. And the wait was worth it. There was joy and excitement throughout the grounds and it set the stage for the return of AirVenture, making us very excited for the future."

Total aircraft: More than 10,000 aircraft arrived at Wittman Regional Airport in Oshkosh and other airports in east-central Wisconsin. At Wittman alone, there were 16,378 aircraft operations in the 10-day period from July 22-31, which is an average of approximately 116 takeoffs/landings per hour when the airport is open.

Total showplanes: 3,176 included: A record 1,420 vintage aircraft registered, plus 1,089 homebuilt aircraft, 354 Warbirds, 148 aerobatic aircraft, 112 seaplanes, 33 ultralight's, and 27 rotorcraft.

Camping: More than 12,000 sites in aircraft and drive-in camping accounted for an estimated 40,000 visitors.

Volunteers: More than 5,000 contributing in excess of 250,000 hours.

Commercial exhibitors: 747.

Forums, Workshops, and Presentations: A total of 1,055 sessions hosted throughout the week.

Social Media, Internet and Mobile: More than 18.95 million people were reached by EAA's social media channels during AirVenture, with engagement of 1.08 million; EAA video clips during the event were viewed 3.48 million times.

International guests: Despite travel restrictions that greatly limited the number of attendees from other nations, EAA still welcomed visitors from 66 countries during the week.

The Gathering shines: The EAA Aviation Foundation's annual event to support its aviation education programs attracted more than 500 people and raised more than \$1.7 million dollars that will be focused on EAA's mission of growing participation in aviation.

Media: 567 media representatives on-site, from four continents.

Economic impact*: \$170 million for the five counties in the Oshkosh region (Winnebago, Outagamie, Fond du Lac, Calumet, and Brown). * - based on 2017 University of Wisconsin Oshkosh economic impact study

What's ahead for EAA AirVenture Oshkosh 2022? (July 25-31, 2022) Comment from Pelton:

"Planning is well underway for next year's event, including discussions during AirVenture 2021 about possible features and attractions for 2022. We also look forward to welcoming more international visitors next year to return AirVenture to a truly global reunion. In the next few months, we will be finalizing highlights in all areas to make the 69th EAA fly-in convention the World's Greatest Aviation Celebration."


